Dr. Roy S. Lee, LL.B. (China), LL.M. (McGill University, Canada), Ph.D. (London, United Kingdom).

Dr. Lee worked for the United Nations Secretariat from 1967 to 1998 where he handled human rights issues (in Division of Human Rights till 1972) and in the Office of Legal Affairs legal and policy issues of environmental law, treaty-making, human rights, law of the sea, international humanitarian law, settlement of disputes. He also trained legal advisers and diplomats in multilateral negotiation.

He was the Executive Secretary for the United Nations Diplomatic Conference on the Establishment of an International Criminal Court; Director, Codification Division, for the codification and development of international law; Secretary of the International Law Commission; and Secretary of the Sixth (Legal) Committee of the General Assembly.

He was Special Fellow of the United Nations Training and Research Institute from 1998-2009 and organized training courses for delegates and UN Secretariat members on various subjects of international law and policy.

He taught United Nations law, humanitarian law and peacekeeping at Columbia Law School between 1997 and 2014, during that period he also organized conferences and seminars for UN diplomats. Since 2007 he has been teaching Environmental Diplomacy Practicum focusing on climate change and sustainable development at the Yale University School of Forestry and Environmental Studies, New Haven, Connecticut, USA.

He has been the Permanent Observer to the United Nations for the Asian African Legal Consultative Organization (an intergovernmental institution comprising 47 Asian and African States) since 2009. On a pro bono basis, he organizes and chairs monthly seminars and discussions for delegates of the Sixth Committee (Legal) on such subjects as settlement of dispute, climate change, role of legal advisers, international criminal jurisdiction, sustainable development, marine genetic resources, cyber intrusions, small island states, the least developed states, and dialogue with judges from international courts and tribunals.

He has published, edited and co-edited nine books on space law, law of the sea, the International Court of Justice, norms of democracy, peace problems and international criminal law and procedures, as well as some thirty articles on various subjects and issues of international and environmental law.

He did postgraduate work at McGill (LL.M.) in Canada and London University (Ph.D.), United Kingdom.

He was elected to the Institut de Droit International in 2001 and was a vice-president of the Institut in 2007.

Dr. Lee chairs the Problems of Peace Seminar (The Peace Seminar) of the Columbia University (since 2009).
